

Actions of La Chaîne de l'Espoir

Operate on children

Operate and care for the poorest children in developing countries and transfer them to France when sufficient healthcare means are not available within their native countries.



Impart technical skills and give means to facilitate healthcare locally



By facilitating training programs, La Chaîne de l'Espoir imparts knowledge, technical and theoretical skills to local medical teams in order to develop autonomy and provide care to children locally.

Build and equip hospitals adapted to local needs and realities.

Academic sponsorship

Bring individual academic sponsors and medical support to destitute children in Thailand, Togo, Cambodge, Afghanistan and Haïti.

Develop collective programs to help re-education.
